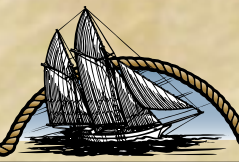

The complex paddle wheels are scratch built from brass and silver soldered and rivited together.

The shaft rotates in scale bearings. All cabins and compartments are fully detailed and furnished.

This remarkable model can be appreciated by anyone who visits the Murray River town of Echuca, as the model is displayed in the town Information Centre. Echuca is of course, the home of the full size P.S. "Adelaide".
